1. Crawford, Mary Caroline. **GOETHE AND HIS WOMAN FRIENDS**. Boston: Little, Brown, 1911. Very Good / No Jacket. 8vo. Green cloth boards with titles in gilt on spine and with gilt titles, decoration, and illustration on upper board, t.e.g.; pp. [4], v-xiii, 452, [1] (ads), plus frontis and numerous b/w plates throughout, all collating complete. First edition, published October, 1911. With a laid-in 1922 newspaper article on Goethe's relationship with Bettina Brentano-Arnim (the subject here of chapter XIII) by Albert Leitzmann.

Corners and board edges worn and frayed, spine tips quite chipped, spine gilt faded, charming bookplate dated 3/13/18 tipped onto front pastedown, internally with just a little age-toning, but generally bright.

The poet's many loves and lays. So to speak.

Bottom board edges lightly dust-soiled, else fine. Jacket panels a touch rubbed, spine tips a little wrinkled, price-clipped; quite smart in new mylar.

Corners worn, upper edge of upper board sunned, spot of soiling on lower board, titles rubbed; small previous owner signature on front pastedown, spot of soiling on rear free endpaper; internally clean and unmarked.

First edition, with a customer-care questionnaire from Simon and Schuster laid in.

Boards a little dusty, top-edge lightly toned, pastedowns age-toned; internally clean and bright. Jacket: beige panels lightly yellowed, but blue spine bright; edges a little shelfworn and rubbed in spots, not price-clipped, bright and fresh in new mylar.

Signed by both Schwarzenegger and Gaines on the half-title page.

Spine puckered, else clean and bright, appearing unread. Jacket the merest touch shelfworn with a few laminate flaws on rear panel; not price clipped, now in new mylar.

In the 1990s Schwarzenegger took an active role in revitalizing physical fitness habits for pre-teens, from 1990-92 serving as Chairman of the President's Council on Physical Fitness.
